Hello and welcome



We want to help you to stay well with diabetes.



Lots of people have diabetes. You do not need to feel alone.



We are here to support you.



If you are worried about anything in this leaflet, speak to your doctor or nurse.

Diabetes checks



When you have diabetes, your doctor or nurse will check things like:



Your blood and your feet.



 What you eat and drink and what you weigh.



What medicines you are taking.



These checks help to spot any changes with your diabetes.

This means you can get any treatment or advice you need as soon as possible.

Having a wee test



This is a really important test. It helps us to spot any changes with your diabetes.



The test is quick and easy to do. There is nothing to worry about.



Your doctor or nurse will give you a pot in a brown paper bag.



You need to wee into the pot then put the lid back on it.



The pot has a sticker on it. Write your name on the sticker.



Then put the pot into the brown paper bag.



You can do your wee test at home.



Or you can do it at your local doctors.



You must take the pot back to your local doctor's surgery on the same day you wee in it.



Don't feel uncomfortable or embarrassed giving your pot back.



Your local doctors will keep your pot safe and private.



They will treat you with kindness and respect.



Doing a wee test is a really good way to check your diabetes and keep you well.
