Bowel Screening



Bowel cancer screening is a test you do at home that checks for signs of bowel cancer. It's offered to everyone aged 50 to 74

Bowel Cancer is one of the most common cancers in the UK. Screening, uses a test called a faecal immunochemical test (FIT) to look for blood in a sample of your poo. This could be a sign of bowel cancer. You collect the sample at home and send it by post to be tested. It can help find cancer before you have any symptoms, which may mean it's easier to treat

Did You Know?

About 98 out of 100 people who use their bowel screening kit do not need further tests



9 in 10 people survive bowel cancer if diagnosed at the earliest stage

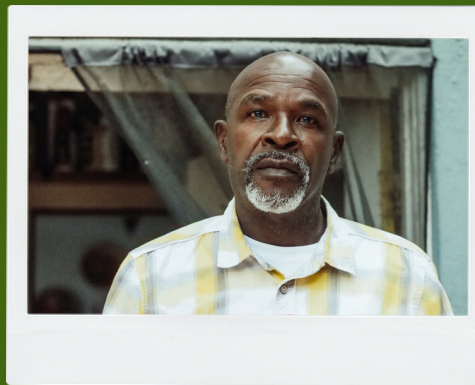


Symptoms of bowel (colorectal) cancer can include bleeding from the back passage, blood in your poo or a change in your normal bowel habit

Bowel cancer is more common in people over the age of 50, but it can affect anyone of any age. If you're below the screening age and have family history or you are worried you may have symptoms of bowel cancer, go to see your GP
